It seems hardly possible that a year has passed since the Community Fridge opened in the Cornerstone Centre. Since then, every Saturday the fridge has offered food - unwanted by the supermarkets - but still perfectly safe to eat. The totals involved are staggering! In the 12 months since starting, the fridge has saved over 8,000kg (8 tonnes!) of food from landfill, and welcomed over 3000 visitors. So if you'd like to help reduce food waste, do come and take a look every Saturday, starting at 10am (finishes around 12 noon). For more info email:

WELCOME TO ST JOHN'S

If you are new to the area, or don't know the church, do come and take a look inside **St John's** - we are located between **Parvis Road** and **Camphill Road** (or look for the tall spire). St John's was built in 1912 and has a lovely peaceful feel - a place to escape from the routine and rush, and take a moment for reflection. Currently, we're open to visitors every day from 10am-3pm (Wednesdays from 11am), and whatever the reason for your visit, you will be very welcome. Of course, we're also open every Sunday for our morning services, and then to around 3pm.

When visiting, you are welcome to wander round; or sit and reflect (we have comfortable seating!); or stay a while in the Prayer Area (to the right, halfway along the building). Opposite the Prayer Area, on the left-hand side, is the Children's Space - with a table for drawing, and some toys/activities that are available to all young people at any time of the day. You may also on occasion hear the organ being played, either for practice or during a lesson.

The church grounds are open and available to everyone, with benches located around the building and also picnic tables - which visitors are welcome to use. Finally, please note St John's is a church for everyone in West Byfleet and the surrounding area - regardless of age, status, gender or sexuality. Do come and visit soon, or join us for a service - you are assured of a warm welcome!

Cornerstone acoustic improvements

Regular users of our **Cornerstone Centre Hall** are delighted by the acoustic rafts that were installed in December, resulting in a much less 'echo-y' space. Designed by local acoustician **Ian Yates from BY Acoustics** (www.byacoustics.com), the rafts hang unobtrusively below the existing ceiling - and 'soak up' the reflected sound, allowing speech to be clearer and the overall noise level to be much reduced. **See p7 for a photo of the new arrangement**.

It's May and colour has returned to the world! The grey, wet, gloomy days are giving way to the brighter shades of spring and summer. In our streets, gardens and parks we are enjoying the fresh green of new leaves and the vibrant colours of flowering trees and plants. All this lifts our hearts. A short but lively service of 'Pentecost Praise' will be followed by toasting marshmallows over firepits outside the church. Please consider yourselves warmly invited and do come if you can.

Looking a little further ahead we will also be holding our annual Summer Fair on 15th June. This is an opportunity to enjoy ourselves and renew our friendships with groups and individuals from across the community. Please do join us and invite your friends!

Finally we are holding a pet service at our partner church, All Saints' New Haw on Sunday 13th July at 3.00pm. We will thank God for the animals who bring so much colour and pleasure to our lives and invite his blessing upon them. Do join us and bring your pets! ORGAN SCHOLARS

In recent years our organ scholars have been awarded university and cathedral organ scholarships - so if you already play the organ and are interested in a position that will provide support and mentoring as you prepare for auditions, do get in contact. Alternatively, if you play the piano to a good level (at least G5) and want to learn the organ, we can help with tuition via the Surrey Organists' Association 'organ student scheme'. This scheme provides an initial package of lessons and has proven successful with many students going on to play regularly in their own or other churches. JUNIOR CHOIR

Our Junior Choir - which was formed last autumn - continues to thrive, practicing every Tuesday in term time, and leading the singing at our monthly Family Eucharist, termly Sunday afternoon services, and on special occasions such as Christmas & Easter. During Advent, the choir performed a lively musical Nativity - 'Sheikh, Rattle & Roll' - which was much enjoyed both by singers



and a large congregation. Several of the young singers have recently



been awarded their white scapulars, following completion of an initial training programme devised by the Royal School of Church Music, and tested by Director of Music, Ian Church. The singers come from a number of schools in the area, so making new friends is one of the benefits of joining! Just as importantly, learning to sing to a high standard builds confidence - as does the opportunity each month to lead the spoken parts of a service. Finally, the children receive 'pay' for every practice and service attended, which provides a small incentive and adds to their pocket money! HOLIDAY CLUB

Following on from our successful first holiday club last summer, we're pleased to announce another one this year! The format is the same again - a week long experience for children who enjoy being active, creative and like music/singing.

Every day starts with a search to find the theme of the day (the hiding places will be different to last year(!), and ends with a short service in church led by the children, in which they sing the pieces they've learnt during the day, and talk about the activities they've been involved in.

The club is limited to a maximum of 30 children (divided into smaller teams) and is ideal for those who like to be busy through the day. But... there's also down time as we have the use of the entire site - church, grounds and hall, so plenty of time for chatting and activities, including watching a video through the week (last year we viewed Joseph & His Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat) and time to make new friends, all under the watchful eyes of church leaders and volunteers.

We had some really positive feedback last year - 'It was lovely to see all of the children's hard work in the service at the end of each day and hear about the various activities and games they had enjoyed as part of the 'theme' of the day. The club was very well organised and thought out.'

There are discounts available for families with siblings and an early bird discount (for bookings before the end of June). There's also a bursary scheme for those who are struggling financially at the moment.

The campaign for Christian Aid Week 2024 features their work in Burundi; read on to find out more...

This year's appeal is focussing on work in Burundi, one of the most densely populated and poorest countries in Africa. Heavily reliant on agriculture, it's also one of the least prepared to combat the effects of climate change, including droughts, floods and landslides. The global cost of living crisis has intensified the challenges: more than 70 per cent of the population live in poverty and more than half of children are chronically malnourished.

Christian Aid has been working in Burundi since 1995 when it first offered humanitarian assistance to people surviving the civil conflict. Now, alongside local partners, the organisation helps establish Village Savings and Loans Associations (VSLAs). These community-led groups mean people can save and borrow money, making small businesses possible, offering reliable and diverse incomes so families can eat regularly, get medicine when they need it, and build safer homes.



35 year old Aline Nibogora is the chairperson of a VSLA which supports some 25 families in a remote village, in Makamba Province. Aline escaped an abusive marriage only to find herself on the streets begging for a place to stay.


Her life changed when she went to a 3 day Christian Aid-funded community workshop. With a small start-up loan, Aline began trading avocados and peanuts locally - then used her profits to buy a bicycle to transport greater quantities of

goods to markets further afield. She's now a grocery wholesaler and living on her own plot of land where she's built a home for her family. In

the next five years she hopes to expand, so one day she can buy a mill. This will provide a source of income without the need to transport heavy goods over long distances.



Philip Galgallo, Country Director of Christian Aid Burundi, said: "In the areas where we work, people without their own small business or income will typically head out on an empty stomach each morning to look for



Most families don't have a water supply, so they'll collect water from rivers or communal water points; the threat of water-borne cholera is ever present. In most instances, neighbouring families share toilets, but it's not uncommon for there to be no communal toilet, forcing people to nearby bushes. Similarly, there are no bathrooms or showers. It's a fragile existence that pushes many to the brink of survival.

Together, we can support families to secure a better future for themselves and future generations. With your help, we can work towards a world where families can escape the trap of poverty and fulfil their ambitions. Join us this Christian Aid Week."

OUR OTHER (QUIETER) SERVICES

Did you know that every week we have two services at St John's in addition to our 10am Service on Sundays? Both these services are quiet, said services of Holy Communion lasting around half an hour, one at 8am on

Sunday and the other at 10am on Wednesday. They take place in the small Memorial Chapel at St John's, near the exit to Cornerstone.

When our boys were young, we often found ourselves rushing around on a Sunday morning taking them to various activities so an early service in the local church was ideal for us. So, if your Sundays are like that why not give our early service a try?

If you are retired or have some time on a Wednesday morning the 10 o'clock service could be just what you need as a mid-week boost. The small congregation usually gets together afterwards for tea or coffee and a chat. Biscuits, and sometimes cake, are available as an added bonus! It's a good opportunity to meet people and get to know them better.



Both services include a short sermon along with the usual prayers, readings and the opportunity to take communion. Many people, whatever their circumstances, find these opportunities to worship God quietly in a small congregation very helpful. So do come along, you will be very welcome. WORSHIP @ St John's

Children are welcome at all of our services!

8am - Holy Communion (said)

A reflective and quiet service of Holy Communion, usually held in the Memorial Chapel. Readings follow the Anglican lectionary, and the service includes a short homily before receiving communion.

10am - Parish Eucharist (Family Eucharist on the 3rd Sunday)

The main service of the week, lasting around an hour. We gather as a church to hear God's word and celebrate communion, receiving Christ in bread and wine. The choir leads our music with plenty of opportunity for the congregation to join in with hymns to worship God. A short reflection helps to explain the readings and guide what God may be saying to us. Prayers are offered for the community and wider world. After the service, refreshments are available in the Church Hall as we continue our fellowship more informally. On the 3rd Sunday - often coinciding with a baptism - the service is shorter, and suitable for parents and children to worship together, in church.

6.30pm - Evening services

Usually on the first Sunday of every month, we meet for worship from a variety of styles - including Choral Evensong, Sung Evensong, Compline, Taize and Songs of Praise. [NB dates may change to coincide with major festivals - eg Advent & Easter; check website for details].

Mondays - 9.30am Morning Prayer

A quiet service based around the Church of England's 'Daily Prayer'. This takes place in the Prayer Area or Memorial Chapel, and lasts around 25 minutes.

Wednesdays - 10am Holy Communion

A reflective and quiet service of Holy Communion; readings follow the Anglican lectionary, and the service includes a short homily before receiving communion.
