Clive writes....

God jul, that's Merry Christmas in Norwegian. Having just spent a few days in that beautiful country we got used to seeing those words in lights on houses and shops. Like many parts of the world Christmas decorations are important to the Norwegians but one difference we noted was that the great majority of the lights were uncoloured. I thought they looked so much better than the multi-coloured lights we usually use. They seemed so much more relevant to the coming of the Light of the World.

There are of course many traditions associated with the Festival and there is much variation between countries, for example the Norwegians have their Christmas Dinner on the 24th not the 25th. Many of those traditions include light and in the more northern countries this is particularly welcome when the sun fails to appear above the horizon for months on end. These differences are hardly surprising given the variety of peoples that celebrate the birth of Jesus but if you look at the four Gospels you will also find great differences in the way the birth is reported. (One of the Gospels doesn't mention it – if you want to know which you could read them or, more easily, listen to this morning's sermon!) The various Gospel approaches to the coming of our Saviour into the world is also unsurprising given the great depth of meaning in the event, in the coming of God to be one of us.

I hope I shall see all of you over Christmas but in case I don't I hope you all have a joyful, holy and peaceful Christmas – **God jul!**
