Today's readings are Matthew 3: 1-12 and Isaiah 11: 1-10

Keith writes....

John the Baptist is often seen as the last of the Old Testament prophets. In his ministry, preparing the way for Jesus, we see the transition from the old order to the new. John is telling Israel that the time is now. God is coming as Jews have long hoped he would. John himself is not the key to this new work of God, but he announces the coming of one, 'mightier than I', who will end the waiting, and bring an end to at least two centuries of apparent silence from God.

What God is going to do will not be comfortable, especially for religious leaders (Pharisees and Sadducees). It will involve repentance and turning anew to God. The Jews can no longer rely on their ethnic heritage alone (as descendants of Abraham) but must live up to their calling as God's people.

The person who comes is, of course Jesus. John seems to see him as a judge, as a fire for the refining of Israel. When we actually meet Jesus, we may wonder whether John had the full picture. Does John anticipate the radical love that characterises Jesus' ministry? Probably not. Nevertheless, the principle of repentance and a renewed turn to God should inform our keeping of Advent.
